


The Military Miniature Society of Illinois

Little Wars 2023 – Guests of Honor JAMES HARRIS & PHIL BOCK





Jim & Phil Little Wars 2004

Jim Harris and Phil Bock met in college in 1989 at ISU in Normal, Illinois where Jim got his Masters in History with honors and Phil a degree in Criminal Justice Administration.

Jim introduced Phil to historical miniature war gaming in 1992 at Winter Wars in Champaign, Illinois. Inspired by attending the Last Square Invitationals in Madison, Wisconsin, they decided to write a ruleset. They created *Wilderness Wars*, designed for gaming the French and Indian War and the American War of Independence. Established in 2002, they called their business Normal Warfare as they both went to college in Normal.

Writing a wargaming ruleset is a delicate balance. Too much history and the game drags out and becomes boring. Too much fun and the game becomes fantasy. With this game mechanism, Jim and Phil feel they have struck that balance.

This is one of the few rulesets for the company and battalion level of this era. It is historically accurate and though easy to learn, it is not simplistic and strategy is the key to success. Many rulesets are designed to have a game played over many hours. *Redcoats* is described as fast and bloody, with even a large scale battle taken to completion in one evening or one convention game slot, 4 hours.

The ruleset was successful and after years of surveying and listening to the feedback from fans of the game, they decided to split the ruleset out, creating one for just the French and Indian War and another for the American War of Independence. In 2019, they created the French and Indian War edition of the ruleset titled with a new name, *Redcoats in the Wilderness*. The rules were debuted successfully at Little Wars that year. In 2022, Jim and Phil won the award for Best Theme Table at Little Wars.

This year, Jim and Phil are debuting their latest in the series: Redcoats in the Wilderness: American War of



Independence Edition here at Little Wars. Though not yet in print, due to Covid, the soon to be published rules will be gamed here as well as the French and Indian War Edition. Normal Warfare extends to you an invitation to join them for warfare in the wilderness.

Board of Directors Elections

Every two years, the members of HMGS-Midwest elect five (5) members to the Board of Directors to manage the affairs of the organization. HMGS Midwest runs the Little Wars conventions as well as other events throughout the year. The election is governed by the organization's recently amended bylaws which include procedures for presenting a slate of candidates and allowing at least 30 days for each member to submit a vote for or against each director presented. The Board members take office on the day after the previous Board members' terms expire or immediately if they have already expired. The current Board members' terms will expire on July 31st, however, this date may be different depending on when the voting can be finalized in any given year.

The deadline in 2023 for members to let the current Board know of their intentions of running for a Board position is May 21, 2023. Interested members can submit a picture and paragraph explaining their interest in the position to bod@hmgsmidwest.com. Voting will be electronic via a voting software application and will be open from approximately June 1 through July 1, 2023. 

Little Wars Convention - General Rules and Policies

Attendee Conduct

Everyone knows that historical miniature gamers are among the most responsible and polite people in the world. But we think it is prudent to remind convention attendees that they are expected to abide by the rules of the convention, as well as any directions given by convention staff and/or the convention site, and, of course, by federal, state and local laws.

Convention Badges

You need an attendee badge! Your badge serves as your ticket of admission to Little Wars, and it is a non-transferable and revocable license. HMGS-Midwest reserves the right to terminate this license at any time, without refund of an attendee's admission, and requires that person to leave the premises. No reasons need or may be given.

Convention staff (identified by special "STAFF" badges/shirts) also may deny you entry to the convention area or request that you leave if you are without your badge – so please wear it in a clearly visible place ABOVE your waist during the convention. If you lose your badge, please come to the Registration Desk and after confirmation, we may be able to print a new badge for you.

Refunds

Due to the high cost of conducting registration for a convention as large as Little Wars, it is not possible for HMGS Midwest staff to issue refunds of any type for any reason without HMGS Midwest Board approval.

Appropriate Use of Language

We want to remind our attendees that we are in a very public setting that includes families. Please remember to be civil in our interactions and refrain from using vulgar language.

Costumes and Weapons

All costumes that depict aspects or uniforms of the 20th and 21st centuries are prohibited unless prior permission is granted by HMGS-Midwest. The reenactors and living historians invited by the Board have received prior permission to wear and bring their kit for educational purposes. Firearms [gunpowder] from any era, are prohibited, including items for "display" purposes. Attendees are not allowed to carry or display weapons of any type. Active-duty military, police, emergency services, or other similar personnel are exempt from this prohibition when in the act of performing their official duties.

Lost or Damaged Materials

HMGS-Midwest and the Sheraton Hotel assume no responsibility for lost or damaged items or possessions, including, but not limited to, Little Wars badges and gaming items. The registration desk will maintain a lost-and-found department. If you lose any items, please notify registration personnel immediately. Property found on the convention site at the end of the weekend will be returned to the owner if possible, with non-returnable items becoming the property of HMGS-Midwest. HMGS-Midwest strongly encourages you to leave nothing unattended.

Little Wars Events Policies

A Note to Parents and Guardians

We would like to remind parents and guardians that the safety of their children is their responsibility. You are also responsible for the supervision of all minors, as well as for their behavior at the convention site. Please make certain that minors are appropriately supervised by an adult companion at all times, especially during nighttime hours, when playing in an event, or when back in their hotel rooms.

The venue is responsible for security at their facility (not HMGS-Midwest), and officials from the venue have the right to eject those determined to have caused problems. HMGS-Midwest is not required to offer a refund if your children are removed from the premises. So please, properly supervise minors. They are the future of the hobby. We want them to have an enjoyable – and safe – convention experience.

Event Tickets and Registration

Each event at Little Wars is described on the tabletop events website (see below) including its starting time, location, period of history represented, figure scale and the rules that will be used. All events have Little Wars "Medal of Honor" awards to be given out by the judge. Electronic tickets are used to manage available space in games however all events are FREE!

You may register for as many events as you can play each day. In other words, you are not allowed to register for two simultaneous events. All events are open for registration at any time. You can also return an electronic ticket on tabletop events so that another person can use it to sign up. If you are having trouble registering, please visit the events desk.

A Badge is Required to Play or Shop

Many people will be roaming through the game hall without badges. The public is invited to see what we are about so they might add to our numbers. Some will have a visitor pass. All Game Judges need to help us make sure that all players have an official badge showing that they have paid for the convention to help HMGS-Midwest cover the costs of playing in this wonderful facility. Those who want to shop and not play may purchase a Shopper's Badge at a reduced price per day.

Event Cancellation & Additions

If you discover a judge has not shown up for a game that has not yet been cancelled, please contact the events desk. The convention staff has no control over judges actually showing up to run their games. The occasional cancelled game is a risk of playing at cons!

Event Standby – "Alternates"

Judges must first accommodate players holding electronic tickets. Accommodation of additional, non-ticket-holding players (especially beyond the advertised maximum number of players) is at the judge's discretion. Judges are asked to do this on a first-come basis. Judges who allow someone to play without a ticket must ensure that the player has a badge that covers the convention day in question, as everyone else does.

Open Gaming

Did you bring terrain and figures to setup a game at the convention? Would you like to run your already-scheduled event additional times? We may have some space available. Inquire at the events desk. Available space is allocated on a first-come basis.

<u>Judges and Volunteers – We Need You!</u>
As with any volunteer organization, we live or die by the efforts of our volunteers (judges, desk workers, etc.) Our principal planners donate literally hundreds of hours of their time to planning this convention before it begins. A couple of hours of your time judging or helping attendees while on-site are necessary to help the convention finish well. If you wish to be added to the Judge or Volunteer mailing list for next year, please notify the registration desk.

Special Prizes for Judges at Little Wars

Of course, all Judges deserve our thanks for the time and effort put into their wonderful offerings. Two prizes will be awarded this year –

Non-historical games are ineligible:

The Theme Prize - "Damn The Torpedoes!"

Evaluated by a selected panel of judges on how well the subject matter, execution and experience of the game reflect this year's theme.

The Best Of Show Presentation – The Duke Seifried Award Prize

In honor of Duke Seifried, a "force of nature" in the miniatures gaming hobby for decades, this award will be presented to the historical game that the judges panel deems to have the most creative table setup including criteria such as originality and overall appearance.

Todd Fisher Award Recipients

The HMGS-Midwest Todd Fisher Award was established by the Chapter Board in 2011 specifically to provide a means to recognize those individuals that have been instrumental to HMGS-Midwest through distinguished service at its gaming conventions and related events. In keeping with the mission of HMGS-Midwest, individuals may also be recognized for their use of miniature gaming to aid in the teaching of history in an educational setting. It is the hope that award recipients will serve as a source of inspiration to others who might volunteer their time and efforts towards our hobby through HMGS-Midwest. Recommendations for each award category must come from a current member of HMGS Midwest using the procedure noted below.

<u>The Prior Service Award</u> – (Minimum length of service of 3+ years) The recipient would be an individual whose prior service was exemplary and honorable to the HMGS-Midwest organization. (BOD/Staff/Volunteer/GM etc.) A committee consisting of the current Medal Holders would vote on appropriately recommended candidates.

<u>The Active Service Award</u> – (Minimum length of service of 3+ years) The recipient would be an individual whose active service is exemplary to the HMGS-Midwest organization. (BOD/Staff/Volunteer/Educator, etc.) A committee consisting of the current Board of Directors would vote on appropriately recommended candidates. Current Board members are exempt from receiving the award.

<u>The Posthumous Service Award</u> – (Minimum length of service of 3+ years) The recipient would be an individual whose prior works and service are exemplary and honorable to the HMGS-Midwest organization.

(BOD/Staff/Volunteer/GM/Education/Publications/Creations etc). A combined committee consisting of the current Board of Directors and Medal Holders would vote on appropriately recommended candidates.

Todd Fisher

Todd Fisher is recognized as one of the founders of HMGS-Midwest and was the Little Wars Convention Director during its infancy. Serving for 10 years in that position he had to face the rigors of running the convention, snow storms, contracts and cancellations. Most importantly, building a solid foundation for others to work with in making the convention what it is today. He served on the HMGS-Midwest BOD for 14 years and on the HMGS-East BOD for 5 years. He was also a prominent figure in the fight against the lead ban aimed at our hobby. This work was successfully concluded when the New York State Health Commission's ban on lead figures was overturned

The Past Service Award Winner – Tony Adams

Tony Adams was instrumental in establishing the miniatures hobby in the Chicagoland area 40+ years ago. He was the main driver behind miniatures in the Chicago Wargamers Association and the Chicago Wargamers Incorporation. He did this work for years. Tony was the straw that stirred the drink for gaming in Chicagoland for the ten years before Little Wars. It was a conversation that Todd Fisher had with him following a disappointing CWI Con that ultimately led to the formation of Little Wars. He helped form the organization that eventually became HMGS-MW and named the convention Little Wars after the HG Wells book. He continued to be a presence within the hobby and managed the Emperor's Headquarters for several years. He ran excellent games at Little Wars after the formation of the convention.

The Active Service Award Winner – Tod Kershner

When I was a little kid in the 1950s, I loved miniatures, building models and TV shows and movies featuring historical military subjects (Davy Crockett, Zorro and, of course westerns). About a year after I graduated from Michigan State University in 1972 (majored in History and Social Sciences) I played my first actual wargame: Panzerblitz. In the mid seventies I started building 1/32 scale tank models and painting the figures that came with them. In 1977 I attended, as a board game dealer (SPI), my first wargaming convention, Gencon at the Playboy club in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, where I saw my first miniature wargames set up and my addiction immediately deepened. You mean I can combine my two wonderful hobbies: painting figures and wargaming! Since then I have been in and out of the business side of gaming as a distributor, hobby store owner (Battle Creek, MI), commission figure painter and rules author. In the mid seventies I met my first two fellow wargamers in my home area: Dale Wood and John Simmons and they became my regular opponents and lifelong friends. Dale and I created a set of rules for 18th century battles, "Warfare in the Age of Reason", and began regularly playing it and running it at conventions. In 1984 I printed them off on an Atari 800 computer and a 9-pin printer and began selling it through Bill Protz's Seven Years War Journal and Hal Thinglum's Miniature Wargamers Association Newsletter (MWAN). It proved to be popular and in 1993 my friend, Todd Fisher, published a nice, professional edition for his Emperor's Press publishing company. This was voted "Best Wargaming Rules" by Duncan McFarlan's Miniature Wargames magazine. Dale and I followed it up with "Warfare at Sea in the Age of Reason" and "Warfare in the Age of Discovery". Other rule sets I have published included "Pig Wars: When Men were Men and Pigs were Money", "Warfare in the Age of Napoleon", "By the Sword Decided" (medieval), an ACW set "A Fire Bell in the Night" (with Dale Wood and John Simmons) and several others. In 1981 Dale and I attended the Little Wars convention in Chicago (might have been the first one) and ran Age of Reason games there throughout the 80s. Here I met Todd Fisher who has been a close friend ever since plus many other wonderful gamers who showed me gaming "the Chicago way". I have run games at many conventions in the Detroit and Chicago areas and at Pacificon in San Francisco, Border Wars in St. Louis, Hot Lead in Toronto, and at Historicon and Cold Wars. In 1989 Dale and I ran our first convention "Peninsula Campaigns" in Kalamazoo, Michigan and ran it annually for 17 years. In 2013 I was honored to be voted into the HMGS Legion of Honor. At 73, a dedicated and enthusiastic wargamer. I love all aspects of the hobby: miniature painting, scratch building, research, war movies and westerns, designing rules but most of all the wonderful life-long friends I have met over 5 decades in the hobby, "We don't stop playing because we grow old. We grow old because we stop playing". George Bernard Shaw.

<u>The Posthumous Service Award Winner – Greg Novak</u>

Greg Novak was a gamer's gamer. He was first and foremost an historian. He was cited in many historic non-fiction books for his work. He was innovative and prolific and his games were unique, educational and fun. He loved obscure parts of history and ran campaigns and megagames. He gamed in so many rules, eras and scales it is hard pin down his favorite - but those who knew him best might pick the AWI (where he gamed in 1:1 as a charter member of the North West Territory Alliance (NWTA), an American Revolutionary War reenactment organization located in the Midwest). His work in history and gaming was recognized internationally by many historians. His rules and games were also published by prominent companies. For GDW, he wrote Fire and Steel, Volley and Bayonet and the Command Decision supplement Over the Top. He edited the acclaimed Command Post Quarterly for GDW and was a play tester and contributor for many other GDW games. He wrote Charlie Company and co-wrote Rough Riders. Greg founded Winter War in the early seventies (which is still running after over 50 years). He was instrumental in building the Miniatures Gaming portion of the University of Illinois Game club and encouraging young gamers to come into the hobby. He was one of the founders of the Central Illinois Tabletop Warriors (CITW), and one offshoot of CITW was the annual Wilderness project (one of which had 116 players and judges in a single game sprawling across multiple battlefield tables and HQs all in separate rooms playing simultaneously while still interacting between rooms and bringing true "fog of war" knowledge into a massive battle). He was active in the volatile early days of HMGS Midwest and was president for almost an hour (yes, one hour). Greg also supported other HMGS Chapters and conventions, which led HMGS-East to award him the Legion of Honor. He was a Little Wars vendor as one of the owners of Ulster Imports. They imported and sold FreiKorps 15s and Ulster Import's own publications (where he originally published his Yellow Ribbon rules). His less serious publications he published with Merde Press (when asked if he knew what Merde meant he would without batting an eye he would say, "The guard dies, it does not surrender". OK he had a sense of humor too!). As a middle school librarian, he encouraged his students to play games in the library after school and invited respected fellow gamemasters to run them. His concern for the youth of Champaign continued after he retired from teaching, and he was elected to the school board. He started an innovative academy in Champaign designed to let students who had fallen behind, but were willing to volunteer to do the work to catch up in a more intense but less rigid environment. The Academy was named for Greg after he passed. It is hard to capture the impact of someone who did so much for so many without really expecting little more than friendship in return. Greg was a role model for all gamers and he is sorely missed.
